



Blue Eye Samurai, Episode: The Great Fire of 1657 - A Netflix Series / 3 Arts Entertainment and Blue Spirit Productions - Toby Wilson, James Wilson, Emil Mitev

Production Designer Toby Wilson joined Disney after more than seven years in the video game industry at Electronic Arts. He served as production designer on the 2011 installment of Medal of Honor and was a lead concept artist and story artist on several games, including Medal of Honor Airborne, Boom Blox, Lord of the Rings RTS and Goldeneye: Rogue Agent. He is a Southern California native and graduate of Otis College of Art & Design.

With over 25 years in animation, James Wilson joined Blue Eye Samurai as Art Director to engage all the skills of innovation, design, and management that he has acquired over his time in the industry.

Emil Mitev has been in the animation industry for 20 years, but remains excited and passionate about breaking ground in animation, seamlessly blending design, lighting, and color, and building unique worlds to excite hungry eyes and minds. After graduating from Fine Art Academy in Sofia, Bulgaria with an M.F.A. in Scenic and Costume Design-and creating major set and costume designs for theatrical performances across Bulgaria and France-Emil found his calling in animation. He moved to Los Angeles, where he remains today.

Charles Huettner is a Pennsylvania-based artist working in animation. After years of making short films and freelancing for various companies, he co-created the TV show Scavengers Reign in 2021, where he served as a co-showrunner, Writer and Art Director.

With more than 15-year career as a Concept Artist and Designer, Carlos has worked on films such as Pacific Rim, Colossal, Color Out of Space, Open Windows and Automata. Parallel to his work as Concept Artist, Carlos has directed multiple 2D animation projects as opening titles or animation sequences in Spanish films such as Gernika, Zip v Zap 2 and Torrente V. In 2020, he finished his short film Wayback, nominated for three Quirino awards and selected a candidate for the Goyas. His most recent work is the art direction for Sith, the short film directed by Rodrigo Blaas, part of the Star Wars Visions series.

Aidan is a graduate of San Jose State University where he studied in the Animation / Illustration program. He always had a love for art and animation gave him a way to help bring it to life. In his short career, Aidan has worked on projects including *Spies in Disguise* (character design), *Ice Age: Collision* (Character Design, Set Design, Color Design) and *Ice Age: Continental Drift* (Junior Designer). He currently serves as a production designer and character art director on Netflix's *Nimona*. Aidan loves the outdoors, traveling, climbing and surfing in his free time.



Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse - Sony Pictures Animation - Patrick O'Keefe, Dean Gordon

Production Designer and Art Director Patrick O'Keefe has worked on a variety of films, video games, commercials, shorts, virtual reality short films and television shows. He has contributed as as a visual development artist, a background painter and a concept artist. O'Keefe studied illustration at Sheridan College before transferring to the Emily Carr University of Art and Design, where he received his Bachelor of Media Arts in Film and Animation Design.

Art Director and visual development artist Dean Gordon graduated from the Art Center College of Design, joining Sony Pictures Animation in 2007. Gordon started his career in television as a background color stylist and background artist on series such as A.L.F., BraveStarr, She-Ra: Princess of Power and Ghostbuster, then worked for 16 years at the Walt Disney Animation Studios as an art director and background supervisor artist on many features (including Aladdin, Beauty and the Beast and The Little Mermaid).



Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles: Mutant Mayhem – Paramount Pictures and Nickelodeon Movies Yashar Kassai, Arthur Fong, Tiffany Lam

Mutant Mayhem is a teenage coming of age story masquerading as an action film. The audience experiences the world of *Mutant Mayhem* through the lens of young teen protagonists. To honor this, the movie's entire design language pays reverence to a sacred time in all our lives: beginners' art class. The art department peeled away their years of formal training and drew as if they were fifteen years old again. Every character, building, and car drawn by the shaky and unskilled hand of a young teen artist. Objects in the world are imperfect, unfinished and ridden with mistakes. Teenage art wants to be taken seriously but lacks the necessary skill to accomplish that, and this gap between intention and skill is what makes it so endearing. This design language is balanced with surreal lighting and alien color schemes that embrace darkness and feel more akin to live-action film.



The Boy and the Heron - Studio Ghibli / Distributed by GKIDS - Yoji Takeshige

Born in Philadelphia in 1964, Takeshige studied at the Tama College of Art, majoring in oil painting. His first credit for a Studio Ghibli film was on My Neighbor Totoro, as a background artist. After working on several Studio Ghibli films, he first became the art director on the short feature On Your Mark and served as Art Director on Princess Mononoke, My Neighbors the Yamadas, Spirited Away, Howl's Moving Castle, Tales from Earthsea and The Wind Rises. He shared the Art Director credit with Noburu Yoshida for The Secret World of Arrietty and was the Art Director of Miyazaki's The Boy and the Heron. Besides Ghibli films, he was also credited in feature films including Oneamis No Tsubasa, Patlabor The Movie and Ghost in the Shell. He was awarded Best Production Design at the 9th Tokyo Anime Award for his work on Summer Wars.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the 51st Annie Awards! We are honored to celebrate another incredible year in animation with all of you tonight. Wow! Just one look at the Annie Award nominees this year, and you can see the pure creative strength and artistic visions that permeate our screens.

Last year was our 50th anniversary and it was a banner year indeed. Our organization is stronger than ever! Our dedicated board of directors and hardworking staff meet regularly to identify ways to support and promote important initiatives for the animation community at large.

Here is a summary of the work we've done, and goals achieved in 2023:

- We sponsored AMPAS (Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences) with a matching donation to preserve and display the Steven Spielberg collection of rare animation cels.
- ASIFA-Hollywood's Film Preservation Initiative funded several important restoration projects, including: Terrytoons "French Fried" (1930), a Max Fleischer Color Classic "Hold It!" (1938), and the rare trailer for the Fleischer "Superman" (1941) cartoon series.
- ASIFA-Hollywood's Animation Educators Forum (AEF) provided more faculty grants and student scholarships this year than ever before with \$50K in student scholarship and \$30K in faculty grants.
- The ASIFA-Hollywood diversity committee inspired the board to form new relationships and support orgs who's goals and commitment to DEIA align with ours, including: the BRIC Foundation, Afro Animation Summit, and the Abidjan Animation Film Festival.
- Our board members and staff connected with so many of you at a variety of conventions, film festivals, events and screenings and panels that we hosted thought the year to packed houses.
- And... ASIFA-Hollywood sponsored our first film production with a goal of bringing empathy and education to war-torn areas in the short, animated PSA "Jasmine" (heading to the festival circuit).
- And of course...we continued our tradition of honoring the best of the best in animation at
- the 50th Annies, our flagship black-tie award show where we all get to re-connect and celebrate our fabulous community.

We couldn't do this without all of you! Our membership has grown to 3300+ strong- this is a powerful creative diverse group of artists. You continue keeping animation on the cutting-edge and relevant by pushing the boundaries of what this incredible artform can do.

We thank you all for an amazing year!



For technical advancements that make a significant impact on the art or industry of animation.



JOHN OXBERRY

John Oxberry, a pioneering figure in animation camera engineering, revolutionized the industry with his groundbreaking innovations. Born in 1918 in New York, Oxberry displayed a natural aptitude for engineering from a young age, beginning his animation career making training films in the Army Signal Corps during WWII, where his passion for precision and creativity merged.

After the war, John started developing the Oxberry Animation Stand, a specialized camera system designed to capture the frame by frame process of filming animation with unparalleled accuracy and efficiency. This invention revolutionized traditional animation techniques, allowing animators to achieve smoother and more complicated camera movements and intricate photographic details with ease.

Throughout his career, Oxberry collaborated with animation studios large and small, earning accolades for his technical expertise and innovative solutions. His animation stands and optical printers were, for many years, the industry's diamond standard, but he wasn't satisfied to make his equipment available only to his professional clients, designing the Oxberry Super 8 animation stand for young people just starting out. His dedication to advancing the art of animation earned him widespread recognition and cemented his legacy as a trailblazer in the field.

Even today, while animation has become digitized and Oxberry stands are mostly remembered fondly by those of us who used them, John Oxberry's contributions and passion for exactitude tempered with flexibility still influence the animation industry, with his name revered among animators and engineers alike.

Animaniacs, Episode: Talladega Mice - Warner Brothers Animation/Amblin Entertainment/HULU Originals - Steven Bernstein, Julie Bernstein

Five-time Emmy-winner Steven Bernstein and four-time Emmy-winner Julie Bernstein have worked in animation as composers, orchestrators, arrangers, song-writers, conductors, singers and spouses. They most recently teamed up for the reboot of the animated series *Animaniacs*, as well as the animated short *The Boys: Diabolical* (Laser Baby's Day Out). Julie and Steven have individually received commissions for orchestral works, string quartet arrangements and large-scale choral works.



Babylon 5: The Road Home, Special Production - Warner Bros. Animation - Michael McCuistion, Kristopher Carter, Lolita Ritmanis

Michael McCuistion is an Emmy Award-winning composer who writes for film, television, multimedia and the concert hall. Nominated for ten Emmy Awards and five Annies, he also collaborated with the world-famous Griffith Observatory Planetarium to score the celebrated *Time's Up*.

Kristopher Carter received an Emmy for Batman Beyond, seven other Emmy nominations and five Annie nominations. He also has written music for many award-winning feature film, co-composed the Emmynominated *Mayhem of the MusicMeister* and composed lauded piano/orchestra works.

Grammy-, Emmy- and SCL Award-winning Lolita Ritmanis composed the Oscar®-shortlisted symphonic score for *Blizzard of Souls*, as well as for projects from *Justice League* to *Teen Titans*, *Batman Beyond* to *Ben 10*. She co-founded the Alliance for Women Film Composers. Her music has been performed at the Lincoln and Kennedy Centers, as well as Carnegie Hall.



Pacemaker, Short Film - A Running Commentary - Christopher Lennertz

Christopher Lennertz is an acclaimed composer and songwriter who has left his mark on every genre imaginable. With two Emmy nominations, a Grammy-winning album, and over twenty BMI awards, Lennertz has become a sought-after storytelling partner. Now, adding writer and director to his resume, he becomes one of Hollywood's brightest and most respected musical creators and storytellers.





Star Wars: Visions, Episode: Aau's Song – Lucasfilm Ltd. – Markus Wormstorm, Nadia Darries, Dineo du Toit

Signed to Sound Ink NY records at 19, Markus Wormstorm is a Composer, Game Developer and Writer currently completing a MA at UCT. He has scored campaigns for global brands, created a mobile game, and taken wins and nominations for several awards (including a Cannes Lion, Clio, Canal+, SAFTA and Annecy Award).

Nadia Darries is a director, animator, songwriter and co-founder of Goon Valley Animation. Born in the Cape Flats, Darries has worked since 2015 in animated film and motion design as an animator, project manager, creative director and director. She animated on the award-winning BBC films Stick Man, Revolting Rhymes and Highway Rat.

Dineo Grace du Toit has always had a flair for the dramatic. A natural dancer, she started ballet at the age of three and later moved to gymnastics where she thrived, earning herself many medals. She was cast as the singing voice of "Aau" in the Triggerfish/Lucasfilm short Aau's Song, then as "Kiya" on Disney's Kiya & the Kimoja Heroes.



The Smeds and the Smoos, Short Film - Magic Light Pictures - René Aubry

A multi-instrumentalist and prolific composer for dance, theatre and cinema, René Aubry is the creator of some unclassifiable sound universes listened to (and loved) for more than 40 years. As an eminently solitary composer, he works all by himself from his wooded studio-house: guitars, mandolin, strings, keyboards, percussions, machines, he plays everything and, as a freedom-loving researcher, creates a music full of uniqueness and with its own strongly recognisable colour. René has composed 11 films for Magic Light Pictures.

Elemental - Pixar Animation Studios - Thomas Newman, Ari "LAUV" Leff

Thomas Newman has composed music for more than 80 motion pictures and television series and has earned 15 Academy Award nominations, one Emmy Award and six Grammy Awards. He has contributed distinctive and evocative scores, over the past several decades, to a long list of acclaimed films.

For as much as LAUV (Steal the Show song: Music by/Lyrics by/Performed by) is known for his intriguing and inventive soundscapes, the multi-Platinum chart-topping singer, songwriter, producer, and multi-instrumentalist asserts himself as a storyteller, first and foremost. His stories continue to enchant audiences everywhere by converting the magic around him into generational anthems. His global smash *I Like Me Better* went sextuple-Platinum in the US and platinum in twelve other countries.



Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse - Sony Pictures Animation - Daniel Pemberton, Metro Boomin

Daniel Pemberton is an Academy Award®-nominated and Emmy-winning composer and songwriter. He has scored films for legendary figures such as Ridley Scott, Danny Boyle, Michael Mann, Aaron Sorkin, David O Russell, Phil Lord and Chris Miller, Edward Norton and Guy Ritchie. With 52 Billboard Hot 100 hits as a lead artist, his discography encompasses a veritable treasure room of platinum. The official soundtrack for *Spider-Man: Across The Spider-Verse* has vaulted into the Top 10 of the Billboard 200 and logged seven straight weeks on the Billboard Top Soundtrack Albums Chart.





Suzume - CoMix Wave Films Inc. and STORY inc. - Kazuma Jinnouchi, RADWIMPS

Born in 1979 in Hiroshima Prefecture, Kazuma's original score composition for the Metal Gear Solid video game series put him on that map in 2006. From there, he continued to score various video games, films and anime soundtracks. In 2016, he was nominated for the BAFTA Best Music award for his work on *Halo 5: Guardians* and worked on the 2019 release of Marvel's *Iron Man VR*. He currently splits his time between Seattle, Washington, Los Angeles, California, and Tokyo, Japan.

Formed in 2001, Japanese rock band RADWIMPS made their major debut in 2005. The band's music for Shinkai's previous record-breaking animated feature films—*Your Name*. and *Weathering with You*—led to a Japanese Academy Award for Best Original Score. RADWIMPS tour extensively around the world.


Robot Dreams - Arcadia Motion Pictures - Daniel Fernandez Casas





Born in 1985 in Nagano Prefecture, 3DCG Chief Yoshitaka Takeuchi has been a part of every Makoto Shinkai directed film since 5 Centimeters Per Second. Beyond his role in Shinkai's films, Takeuchi has directed and supervised several projects. In 2018, he made his directorial debut with the original work Small Fashion Show, part of the Japan-China collaborative animation Shikioriori.

Born in 1967, Hiroyuki Seshita has been involved in the CG and VFX production since the 1980s, as well as game movie productions (like the *Final Fantasy* series). Some of Seshita's directing credits include: *Knights of Sidonia, Ajin, BLAME!*, the *GODZILLA* trilogy, *Lupin III vs. Cat's Eye, GAMERA -Rebirth-*, and *KamiErabi God.app*. In Makoto Shinaki's *Suzume*, Seshita was in charge of CG character direction for the film.

Born in 1981 in Saitama Prefecture, Ryosuke Tsuda—Suzume's Director of Photography—launched his career as a compositor at Anime International Company after graduating from Tokyo Zokei University in 2004. Tsuda first collaborated with director Makoto Shinkai on *Your Name.*, then followed by *Weathering with You*. Joining the recently established TROYCA Inc. in 2013, Tsuda focused on compositional and VFX work.

Arts and design professional Lukasz Mackiewicz is an experienced Visual Effects Supervisor with skills that lie across both compositing and animation. He holds a Master's Degree focused in Intermedia Faculty from the animation department of the Jan Matejko Academy of Fine Arts.

Kamil Polak attended the Academy of Fine Arts (in the faculty of Painting) in Warsaw, as well as the famous Polish National Film School in Lodz. In 2006 he was leading a team of computer animators on the British-Polish stop motion animation *Peter and the Wolf*, which won an Oscar® in 2008 for Best Animated Short.

WINSOR McCAY AWARD

Recognition for career contributions to the art of animation

The Winsor McCay Award, named for the most influential of character animation pioneers, was the first Annie Award established by Asifa-Hollywood and is awarded to a maximum of three individuals annually in recognition of lifetime or career contributions in direction, animation, design, writing, voice acting, sound and sound effects, technical expertise, music, education, or for other endeavours which exhibit an outstanding devotion to and promotion of excellence in the art of animation.

CHARLOTTE 'LOTTE" REINIGER

Charlotte "Lotte" Reiniger (1899–1981) created over sixty animated films during her career, animating her first film in 1919 and her last in 1980.

Reiniger's renown owes greatly to her innovative use of silhouette. Her work is marked by use of meticulous, intricate figures, hand-cut from paper and cardboard and animated using stop-motion. These figures, hinged at joints, were back lit against elaborate backgrounds that she crafted from translucent paper and acetates and filmed with a many leveled photographic rig, a precursor to the multiplane camera. Reiniger's most widely known work, *The Adventures of Prince Achmed* (1923–1926), is today considered the oldest surviving animated feature film, premiering more than ten years before Disney's *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*.



Reiniger also created the screenplays and storyboards for her films, as well as contributing to liveaction productions, such as *Tosca* (1940-1941) and *La Signora dell'Ovest* (1941-1942), directed by her husband Carl Koch.

Before leaving Nazi Germany in 1935, Reiniger was deeply involved in Berlin's avant-garde scene. There she collaborated with artists like directors Walther Ruttmann and Fritz Lang, playwright Bertolt Brecht and fellow animator Oskar Fischinger. She also produced several films for the Institut für Kulturforschung as well as advertising films. The war drove Reiniger and Koch to England, then Italy and then, finally, in 1949 back to England, where Lotte would continue to make animated films for the next thirty years.

Besides her stop-motion work, Reiniger designed costumes, staged puppet shows and illustrated books, making notable contributions to the theater, opera and experimental cinema. Despite an uphill battle to find an audience, Reiniger continued throughout her eclectic and prolific career to produce beautifully animated films marked by a delightfully unique blend of satire, sensuality and contradiction.

Overlooked no more, we hope that this Winsor McCay award will, in some small way, draw more attention and interest to the life, work and genius of Lotte Reiniger.

Recognition for career contributions to the art of animation



MARCY PAGE

Born and raised in California, Marcy Page has worked in animation for over 40 years. freelanced in animation with over a dozen companies and taught animation courses at San Francisco State and California College of Arts & Crafts, in addition to pursuing her independent animation craft. Her personal film, Paradisia (1987), garnered awards at over a dozen international festivals.

Page immigrated to Canada in 1990. There, she joined the National Film Board of Canada, first as a Director and Associate Producer, and then as a producer. As a producer in the NFB's English studio, she sought out eclectic and unusual works

that pushed the boundaries of the medium. Six of these earned nominations in Short Animation from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, with two going on to win coveted Oscars[®].

Over the course of her NFB career, Page has helped shape dozens of acclaimed films—both narrative and non-narrative—from both emerging and seasoned directors. Collectively, these have garnered over 300 international awards and honors for the program.

Marcy retired with plans to pursue her first love: directing and animating personal work.



JOE HISAISHI

Joe Hisaishi was born in Nagano, Japan.

Hisaishi's interest in minimal music began while he was a student at the Kunitachi College of Music. Since his debut album—*Information*, in 1982—Hisaishi has released nearly 40 solo albums.

Hisaishi quickly made a name for himself as a film music composer working closely with Hayao Miyazaki, for whom he composed 11 scores, including *Nausicaä of the Valley of the Wind, My Neighbor Totoro, Princess Mononoke, The Wind Rises* and *The Boy and the Heron.* He also composed notable scores for Takeshi Kitano (such

as *Kids Return* and *HANA-BI*). Overall, Hisaishi has been involved in the music for 80+ films, many of which have received awards, and received the Japanese Academy Award for Best Music seven times and the 2009 Medal of Honor with the Purple Ribbon (an award of merit from the Japanese government).

Joe Hisaishi is also in demand as a pianist, composer and orchestra conductor, both of classical music and contemporary works, and Principal Music Director of the New Japan Philharmonic World Dream Orchestra. He is currently a Visiting Professor at Kunitachi College of Music, Composer in Residence with the New Japan Philharmonic Orchestra and Principal Guest Conductor with the Japan Century Orchestra.

Since then, every project he as directed has been very well-received, including the 2004 *The Place Promised in Our Early Days*; the 2007 *5 Centimeters Per Second*; the 2011 *Children Who Chase Lost Voices* and the 2013 *The Garden of Words*. His 2016 film, *Your Name*., smashed Japanese box office records and won several awards at the 40th Japan Academy Film Prize, including Excellent Prize for Animation Film, Excellent Prize for Director, Excellent Prize for Screenplay and Excellent Prize for Music, and the Los Angeles Film Critics Association Award for Best Animated Feature. Makoto followed up with *Weathering With You* (2019), which represented Japan for the Best International Feature Film in the 92nd Academy Awards®.

Miyazaki was awarded the Golden Lion for Lifetime Achievement at the 2005 Venice International Film Festival. *The Wind Rises* (2013) was nominated for the 2013 Academy Award® for Best Animated Feature. In 2014, the Board of Governors for the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences presented Miyazaki with an Honorary Oscar® for Lifetime Achievement.





He graduated from the National Film and Television School in the UK in 2011 whereupon he moved to London, working as a storyboard artist on commercials at Nexus studios and Framestore. He then moved to Bristol to work at Aardman Animations on the award-winning series *Shaun the Sheep* as Story Artist and Writer. Since then, Richard worked on several Aardman features before directing *Shaun the Sheep: Farmageddon*, for which he received Academy Award® and BAFTA nominations. Most recently he was Head of Story on the BAFTA-nominated *Chicken Run: Dawn of the Nugget* and has just finished work on the upcoming *Wallace & Gromit* feature with Nick Park.



Nimona - Annapurna Animation for Netflix - Esteban Bravo

Esteban Bravo Palafox, born and raised in Mexico City, began his journey in animation when he moved to the US to study at the Ringling College of Art and Design in Florida. After graduating in 2017, he joined the Story Department at Blue Sky Studios to work on films such as *Spies in Disguise* and *Nimona* until the studio's closure in 2021. His co-directed animated short film In a *Heartbeat* gained widespread acclaim in 2017, winning a Gold Student Academy Award. Bravo also co-directed an animated music video for Freddie Mercury's *Love Me Like There's No Tomorrow* in 2019. Currently, Esteban is working at Pixar as a Story Artist on *Win or Lose*, and their upcoming theatrical release *Elio*.



Robot Dreams - Arcadia Motion Pictures - Maca Gil

Maca Gil is a Storyboard and Comic Artist with seven years of experience working for animated feature films, TV shows and graphic novels. Most recently she worked for five-time Academy Award-nominated studio Cartoon Saloon in *My Father's Dragon, the One-of-a-Kind Marcie* Peanuts special for Apple TV and *Robot Dreams* (as the sole Storyboard Artist for the film). Author of DC comics' *Anti/Hero*, she's currently working on a graphic novel for Marvel, and teaching storyboard and gesture drawing in Spain.



Suzume - CoMix Wave Films Inc. and STORY inc. - Makoto Shinkai

Born in Nagano Prefecture, Japan in 1973, Makoto Shinkai made his commercial debut with short film he produced independently: *Voices of a Distant Star.* Since then, every project he as directed has been very well-received, including the 2004 *The Place Promised in Our Early Days*; the 2007 *5 Centimeters Per Second*; the 2011 *Children Who Chase Lost Voices* and the 2013 *The Garden of Words.* His 2016 film, *Your Name.*, smashed Japanese box office records and won several awards at the 40th Japan Academy Film Prize, including Excellent Prize for Animation Film, Excellent Prize for Director, Excellent Prize for Screenplay and Excellent Prize for Music, and the Los Angeles Film Critics Association Award for Best Animated Feature. Makoto followed up with *Weathering With You* (2019), which represented Japan for the Best International Feature Film in the 92nd Academy Awards®.



The Boy and the Heron - Studio Ghibli / Distributed by GKIDS - Hayao Miyazaki

Born in 1941 in Tokyo, Japan. Miyazaki co-founded Studio Ghibli in 1985 with Isao Takahata. Among his eleven animated features, *Spirited Away* (2001) broke every box office record in Japan and won the Golden Bear at the 2002 Berlin International Film Festival and the 2002 Academy Award® for Best Animated Feature Film. *Howl's Moving Castle* (2004) received the Osella Award at the 2004 Venice International Film Festival. Miyazaki was awarded the Golden Lion for Lifetime Achievement at the 2005 Venice International Film Festival. *The Wind Rises* (2013) was nominated for the 2013 Academy Award® for Best Animated Feature. In 2014, the Board of Governors for the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences presented Miyazaki with an Honorary Oscar® for Lifetime Achievement

Kizazi Moto: Generation Fire, Episode: Moremi - Triggerfish Animation Studio & Lucan Studio - Shofela Coker, Andrew McNally

Nigerian illustrator and director Shofela "Shof" Coker has taken the role of Art Director and Character Designer for several studios. He co-created and illustrated *New Masters*, an Africanfuturist graphic novel, in 2022. His animated works include such projects as the animated documentary Liyana and the Disney+short film *Moremi*. Shof's primary influence comes from a love of Yoruba mythology, sculpture, and the printmaking craft of Southwestern Nigeria.

Andrew McNally is an Annie-nominated director hailing from Cape Town, South Africa. He started his career in live action, helming commercials and campaigns for the likes of Ten Cent and Virgin Active. Having studied animation, Andrew took what he learnt about film production and transitioned to directing animated projects, characteristically bringing the DNA of lenses and staging into his animation work. He has since worked with Disney+ and Triggerfish, producing the three-time Annie-nominated short *Moremi* for *Kizazi Moto: Generation Fire*. Andrew loves developing African stories alongside African creators.

Growing up in Tokyo, Rio de Janeiro and Jakarta, Kenji absorbed diverse cultures that would later influence his storytelling. Across a career of more than two decades, Kenji has storyboarded and directed on a wide variety of popular shows. Beyond animated series, his impactful contributions as a Story Artist extend to animated feature films at Dreamworks and Warner Animation Group

Kai Akira is an animation professional who has worked in both series and feature for the last decade. Kai has storyboard—and, occasionally, character designed—for several animated series and features across multiple studios. Kai is currently working as a Head of Story on an animated feature at Warner Bros.

Growing up in rural Maine, Patrick developed an early obsession with drawing and storytelling. Patrick's love for Writing, Acting, and Cinematography eventually led him to the work of Story Artist, in which role he has teamed up with directors such as Wes Anderson, Genndy Tartakovsky and Mike Judge.

Diego Porral is a Spanish animator and director who graduated from Gobelins L' École de L'Image in Paris. Since then, he has been lucky enough to be part of some of the most interesting projects in the industry: such as Love, Death & Robots; Kill Team Kill, Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse and, most recently, on Scavengers Reign as Episodic Director. In his personal time, Diego has directed several short films, such as Blind Eye and Leopoldo el del Bar, which was longlisted for the Academy Awards®. He is also an incredible flamenco dancer.



Star Wars: Visions, Episode: Screecher's Reach - Lucasfilm Ltd. - Paul Young

Paul is a co-founder of Cartoon Saloon, an IFTA winner and Oscar®, Emmy and Bafta nominee. He produced the animated features *My Father's Dragon, WolfWalkers, The Secret of Kells, Song of the Sea* and *The Breadwinner,* as well as a number of award-winning TV series (including *Puffin Rock, Dorg Van Dango* and *Viking Skool*). Screecher's Reach is a Star Wars Visions short released on Disney+, directed at Cartoon Saloon by Paul. He is also an Award-winning cartoonist and illustrator.

Nick Bruno is an American film director and animator formerly with Blue Sky Studios. *Nimona* is his second film as Director. Bruno was born and raised in Mohegan Lake, NY. He studied illustration and the fine arts at UMass, Dartmouth and went on to receive his Masters at NYU studying computer animation and published his own graphic novel, *URBAN LEGENDZ*. Bruno resides in his hometown, with his wife Allison and their three children.

Troy Quane is a Canadian film director and 27-year veteran of the animation industry. In 1995, having studied Classical Animation at Sheridan College in Oakville ON, he began his career as a traditional animator for Walt Disney Animation Canada. Troy continued as a Senior Animator on various top end commercials and feature films until 2005, when he accepted the opportunity to work as Storyboard Supervisor on the critically acclaimed live-action Disney film *Enchanted*. Troy currently resides with his family in Ridgefield, CT.





Robot Dreams - Arcadia Motion Pictures - Pablo Berger, Benoît Feroumont

Director/Writer Pablo Berger's debut feature film, *Torremolinos 73* (2003), won Best Film at the Malaga Film Festival and four Goya Award nominations. *Blancanieves* (2012) won ten Goya Awards (including Best Film) and represented Spain for the Oscars®. *Abracadabra* (2017) received eight Goya Award nominations and was a finalist to represent Spain at the Oscars. Pablo's latest film, *Robot Dreams* (2023), represents his leap into animation. It premiered at the Cannes Film Festival, received the Contrechamp Grand Prix Prize at the Annecy Film Festival and the EFA Award for Best Animated Film, and now boasts five Annie Awards nominations.

Benoît Feroumont, born in 1969, studied art and comics at Saint-Luc in Liège, then animation at La Cambre. With experience, he has become an established animator (Bzzz, Les Triplettes de Belleville, Dji Vou Veu Volti, Brendan, Astérix et le Domaine des Dieux, Le Lion et Le Singe, Robot Dreams) as well as an acclaimed comic book artist (Wondertown, Le Royaume, Gisèle et Béatrice, Fantasio se Marie). Pablo Berger's film Robot Dreams has just hit cinema screens. Volume 8 of his adult comic Le Royaume and Mou, published by Dupuis, will be out in 2024.



ASIFA-Hollywood is a California 501(c)(3) non profit organization established more than fifty years ago to promote and encourage the art and craft of animation. To achieve this purpose, ASIFA-Hollywood is dedicated to striving for the following goals:

- Support and encourage animation education
- Support the preservation and critical evaluation of the animation industry
- Recognize achievement of excellence in the art and field of animation
- Increase the public awareness of animation
- Act as a liaison to encourage the free exchange of ideas within the animation community
- Encourage journalism documenting current trends and activities in animation

To achieve these objectives, ASIFA-Hollywood sponsors the following programs and projects:

Annie Awards

Since 1972, ASIFA-Hollywood has hosted an annual awards ceremony to honor individuals who have made significant contributions to the art of animation. Originally designed to honor the lifetime achievements of legendary veterans of the field, the Annie Awards now recognizes the year's best animated features, broadcast and media productions, commercials, short subjects and outstanding individual achievements in the field of animation. Qualified members participate in the nomination process and final voting. The Annie Awards are regarded as animation's highest honors, and the ceremony is ASIFA-Hollywood's most prestigious and elegant event.

ASIFA Film Preservation and Archives

Each year, ASIFA continues to restore and preserve animation films that would otherwise be lost, and also works diligently in conjunction with the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences to professionally archive nearly forty years of collected feature animation artifacts, dating back to the earliest days of the art form.

We continue to search for a partner to help us assess and conserve the television assets and other broadcast materials we have collected and hope that we will also be able to revitalize our digital archive efforts for the worldwide use of artists, scholars and students.

Animation Educator's Forum

The Animation Educator's Forum is dedicated to the preservation and promotion of animation through education. Our members, with their diverse backgrounds in both the animation and educational fields, are focused on extending their knowledge and experience to others within the burgeoning worldwide animation community. The AEF is entering its ninth cycle of Student Scholarships and has just completed the sixth Faculty Grant Program as well.

Animation Aid Foundation and Community Allocation Programs

Each year, funds are set aside to help members of our animation community in need. Additionally, over the past several years, we have also established new funding to help pay for scholarships and grants via our Educators Forum, as well as funding for animation preservation, open source initiatives, financial support for ASIFA International and more subsidies for our own year-round events.

Members' Screenings and Events

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THE ASIFA-HOLLYWOOD ANIMATION EDUCATORS FORUM



ASIFA-Hollywood's Animation Educators Forum is dedicated to the preservation and promotion of animation through education. Our growing international membership, with a diverse background in both the animation and educational fields, is focused on sharing its knowledge and experience throughout the animation education community. Thanks to the generous support of ASIFA-Hollywood, our volunteer organization can offer scholarship and grant opportunities, host discussions about current topics of interest at various conferences and events, and feature student work in the online Student Animation Showcase.

ASIFA-HOLLYWOOD'S

Our **Student Scholarship** program is designed to support students enrolled in accredited college animation programs around the world, enabling students to complete animation projects, purchase essential equipment, finalize/present

theses, and conduct research in the field. Proposals are accepted from undergraduate students entering sophomore through senior years and from graduate students working toward the completion of a thesis or dissertation. In 2023, the Scholarship Committee awarded a total of \$44,000 to eight undergraduate and three graduate students from the United States, Canada, France, and Korea. The awards of \$4,000 supported a wide range of animation projects including film production, equipment, and tuition.

The AEF's **Faculty Grant** program is designed to provide support to individuals or groups in the academic setting for reasonable expenditures associated with research, scholarly activity, or creative projects in the field of animation. For 2023, the Faculty Grant Committee gave six awards totaling \$24,300. The selected proposals included support for the development of the animated short film *The Creation Poem Project*, the documentary film, *The Only Woman Animator: Bessie Mae Kelley & Women at the Dawn of Industry*, and for completion of the 2D, hand-drawn animated (re)Tired and 3D animated Cunabula short films.

The AEF also hosts **panel discussions** throughout the year. Coinciding with industry conferences, **Birds of a Feather** (BoF) events are professional roundtable conversations focused on prominent contemporary topics in animation education. This year, Steering Committee members moderated two panels of speakers from the academy and industry focused on AI in August and at CTN eXpo in November. Additionally, for the AEF's **General Membership Meeting** in April, our discussion on the topic of "Does Life Drawing Still Matter" featured Nicole Dial, Associate Manager, School Relations at Walt Disney Animation Studio. Initiated in 2023, the AEF's **Animation Salon** is a new series of informal Zoom lectures and discussions in which a scholar, practitioner, or educator shares current projects, research, and pedagogy. Speakers range from past AEF Faculty Grant recipients to educational and industry professionals who present topics spanning the rich and diverse field of practices and perspectives in animation. Salon topics included "Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion in Animation Education" and "The Hanna-Barbera Legacy in Animation Education."

For the fourth year, the AEF and ASIFA-Hollywood presented the **Student Animation Showcase** celebrating the intense study and dedication to the craft exhibited by graduating students from college-level animation programs around the world. We are proud to continue to present this "first look" at the talent of these graduates as they begin a career in the animation industry.




